Job Description:

The Business and Economics Department at Notre Dame of Maryland University invites applications for a full-time tenure track **Assistant/Associate Professor** to teach a full range of business, management, leadership, marketing, and teamwork courses for both our undergraduate and graduate business students beginning August 2020. This faculty member will also serve as the chairperson for the department. The Business and Economics Department's mission is to develop socially responsible leaders who

understand core business concepts, solve problems ethically, think critically, and communicate effectively to maximize sustainable results for both organizations and the larger society.

The Business and Economics Department delivers the following undergraduate curricula: business, international business, marketing communications; and graduate curricula in leadership and management, nonprofit management, philanthropy, and risk management. The degree programs offered by the Business and Economics Department are accredited by the Accreditation Council for Business Schools and Programs (ACBSP).

Faculty members typically teach across the curricula at both the undergraduate and graduate level weekdays, weeknights, Saturdays, hybrid, and fully online. A significant responsibility of the successful candidate will be teaching management and leadership courses and academically advising students interested in business related careers. Additional responsibilities include teaching courses in at least one other business discipline.

Faculty are expected to take part fully in the life of the University, including advising students, engaging in faculty governance and assisting actively in the work of the Department. Professional and scholarly development consistent with ACBSP standards are expected.

Requirements:

Qualified candidates will have a Ph.D. in business or similar and should have a minimum of five years university teaching experience as an assistant professor or associate professor. Previous experience across variety of modalities to a variety of populations is strongly desired. All instructors are expected to convey course information and communicate with students through the university's online course management system. Preference will be given to individuals who have demonstrated excellence in teaching at both the undergraduate and graduate areas in at least some of the following areas: leadership, teamwork and negotiation, and management and have previous experience with assessment and running academic programs. Other preferred teaching areas include business research, nonprofit management, philanthropy, healthcare administration, and marketing.
