

Assistant Professor of Marketing (Tenure-Track) Washington College

The successful candidate will be expected to teach Principles of Marketing, Marketing Research Methods, and electives related to the candidate's area of interest as well as contribute to the college-wide first-year writing and research seminar program on a rotating basis and supervise senior undergraduate theses. The successful candidate will have demonstrated a commitment to teaching excellence and a strong interest in developing a career as a teacher-scholar in a small liberal arts institution. While a Ph.D. or D.B.A. in marketing or a closely related business field such as advertising or integrated brand promotion is preferred, applicants with relevant industry experience and a relevant business degree (e.g., M.B.A. or M.S. in Marketing) are also highly encouraged to apply.
